Here are just a few ways we made Anderson County and the surrounding region healthier in 2017.

Delivering high quality patient care and supporting our physicians

The most important contribution we make to our community is providing high quality care close to home. Quality and service are at the center of how we care for our patients, and we continually invest in our facility to ensure we can meet the healthcare needs of our community. In 2017, we made **\$1,548,717 in capital improvements**, including new hospital beds, a new EKG machine, an expansion and improvements to our Behavioral Health Center and other facility upgrades and repairs.

Inviting the best physicians into our community and supporting them also is a key driver of our efforts to ensure access to high quality care and service. During the past year, Palestine added **40 providers** in psychiatry; emergency, hospital and general medicines; obstetrics and gynecology; pediatrics; radiology; pathology; cardiology; and gastroenterology.

Creating excellent workplaces for our employees

We strive to create an environment where talent is recognized, job satisfaction is valued and our **495 employees** can effectively use their skills in providing high quality care and service; and we managed and distributed an **annual payroll of \$34,494,433**.

Taking a leadership role in the community

We are proud to be a leader in our region. Supporting local organizations and delivering healthcare to all of our neighbors, regardless of their ability to pay, are foundational to our commitment to the overall well-being of our community.
